¹ SFWAR's understanding of "woman/women" is based on self-identification. SFWAR supports and prioritizes the leadership of transgender, gender variant, intersex and gender non-conforming people.

² After successfully completing our training, volunteers are rape crisis counselors when working with SFWAR. SFWAR requires a 1-year commitment of 32 hours/month and one form of fundraising.

Counseling Program [**certified volunteers only*]

- Hotline: Hotline counselors staff our 24-hour hotline from their home and provide crisis intervention and information to survivors and the community. Counselors cover two 8 hour shifts a month.
- Medical Advocacy: Medical Advocates accompany survivors to SF General Hospital for a medical exam. Counselors cover two 8 hour shifts a month.
- Peer Counseling: In-person counselors provide one-on-one counseling for sexual assault survivors, their family and friends.

Community Initiatives Program [**certified volunteers only*]

- Community Outreach: Community outreach volunteers do grassroots outreach in San Francisco through tabling and street outreach.
- Community Education: Provide presentations to youth in SF schools.

Development Program

- Fundraising: Fundraising/Administrative volunteers work on a variety of fundraising projects, including organizing events, helping with mailings, and office work.

³ A stipend of \$100 is available to our MLAM volunteers upon completion of training, MLAM training and a successful Test Call. An additional \$50 is available upon providing in-person services (accompaniment or in-person counseling) for one client. We pay our MLAM volunteers \$18 per hour for all MLAM services provided. Please refer to Director of Volunteers and Hotline for any questions.
